





Mahatma Gandhi



ohandas Gandhi (known as Mahatma - or 'Great Soul' -Gandhi) was one of the (0) ... C... figures of the 20th century. Gandhi was the man who (1) India on the path to independence from British rule. He (2) freedom for his country through actions which were always (3) on the ideas of nonviolence and peace.

Gandhi was born in India on 2 October 1869. He (4) his childhood in India and at 19 he went to study law in England. At the age of 23, Gandhi got a one-year contract to do legal (5) in South Africa. In South Africa, Gandhi was shocked to see how badly Indian people were treated. Gandhi believed that the best (6) to achieve political and social change was peaceful protest. He always remained true to the ideas of non-violence, even in the (7) extreme situations.

Gandhi eventually returned to India after 21 years in South Africa. When he got back home, Gandhi saw how bad life was for people in India so he began to fight for improved rights there too. He was especially (8) with improving the life of India's lower classes. Gandhi soon became the leader in the movement to free India from the rule of the British, and he (9) In 1947, the British granted India its independence. Tragically, six months after India gained independence, Gandhi was assassinated. He was 78 years old.

The Cheetah

The fastest land mammal on earth is the cheetah. It has the ABLE (0) to run at speeds of up to 114 km an hour. Every part of the cheetah's body is in some way adapted for (25) A full sprint lasts about twenty seconds and RUN never more than one minute. This is because at full speed, the cheetah's body temperature gets raised to such a high level it would be too (26) to continue for long. Still, cheetahs chase **HAZARD** DISTANT their prey over very long (27) up to 3 km. This is LIKE (28) other big cats which chase their prey for only a few hundred metres. While most of the big cats like to hunt under cover of (29) cheetahs hunt during the daytime. They mainly DARK rely on (30) to catch their prey. When hunting alone, SEE MOTION they can remain (31) waiting for their prey to come VARY close enough before they attack. They eat a (32) of small animals such as small antelope, game birds and rabbits. Once INTEREST they have made a kill, cheetahs eat very quickly.
