

# SETTING AND PLOT



Tahiti, San Francisco and Chicago in the early 20th century.

The narration is from the third-person point of view with the primary perspective being that of Bateman Hunter.

In Chicago, Bateman Hunter and Edward Barnard both love Isabel Longstaffe, a cultured, intelligent girl. She gets engaged to Edward. After his father's financial ruin and suicide, Edward enters the business of a Chicago merchant with an agency in Tahiti; he will come back to Isabel in a year or two. Bateman, visits Tahiti during a business trip. He finds that Edward, sacked from the merchant's business, is working in a trader's store, and is the adopted nephew of the notorious fraudster Arnold Jackson. Edward is happy, saying "I never knew I had a soul until I found it here". He intends to marry Jackson's halfcaste daughter. When Isabel learns all this from Bateman, she removes her engagement ring, and happily accepts his proposal of marriage. Bateman looks forward to a successful business career in Chicago.


